

Professional Credentials in Speech-Language Therapy and Speech-Language Pathology

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The requirements for obtaining a professional license as a speech-language therapist and speech-language pathologist in Puerto Rico, as established by Law No. 77 of 1983, are outlined below.

Professional License in Puerto Rico

Academic Requirements:

- **Speech-Language Therapist**: Hold a bachelor's degree in speech therapy or its equivalent from an accredited university.
- **Speech-Language Pathologist**: Hold a master's or doctoral degree in speech-language pathology from an accredited institution.

Exam Requirements

- Pass the exams required by law
 - Submit the <u>exam application</u> to the Board of Examiners of Speech-Language Pathologists.
- Pay the exam and license fee
- Submit documents verifying identity and legal age
- Submit medical evidence from the healthcare professional treating the applicant

Other Requirements

- Have resided in Puerto Rico for the last six (6) months prior to the license application date, excluding occasional absences for professional, business, leisure, or study reasons.
- Provide satisfactory proof of good moral character (criminal record certificate)
- Complete one year of public service

ASHA Certifications

Certificate of Clinical Competence in Speech-Language Pathology (CCC-SLP)

The **Certificate of Clinical Competence in Speech-Language Pathology (CCC-SLP)** or ASHA certification is a nationally recognized professional credential that ensures a speech-language pathologist has met high academic and clinical standards. Obtaining this certification signifies that the professional possesses the knowledge, skills, and competencies necessary to provide high-quality services in the field. This certificate may be a requirement for certain job opportunities in the U.S., facilitates professional mobility between states, and requires ongoing education, ensuring that professionals stay up to date.

General Requirements for CCC-SLP Certification

To obtain certification, candidates must:

- 1. Complete a master's degree in Speech-Language Pathology from an accredited program.
- 2. Pass the Praxis national exam in Speech-Language Pathology.
- 3. Complete a supervised clinical fellowship period.
- 4. Comply with ASHA's Code of Ethics.

Timelines and Costs

The certification process follows a set timeline and requires the payment of fees, which may vary. It is recommended to check the most up-to-date information directly on the <u>ASHA website</u> or the relevant certifying authority.

Certification for Speech-Language Pathology Assistants (C-SLPA) according to ASHA

The **Assistants Certification Program** allows Speech-Language Pathology Assistants (SLPAs) to obtain a credential that validates their education, training, and ongoing competency assessment. This ensures that certified assistants are qualified professionals who can support service delivery in the field. In **Puerto Rico**, this certification corresponds to **Speech-Language Therapists**. It is **not required** to practice the profession in Puerto Rico but serves as a credential granted by ASHA.

The **SLPA certification** validates the competencies of Speech-Language Pathology Assistants (SLPAs) and ensures they meet professional and ethical standards (ASHA, n.d.). To obtain this certification, candidates must meet ASHA's established requirements, detailed below:

- 1. ASHA Offers Three Educational Pathways to Obtain SLPA Certification:
 - Associate degree in SLPA (2 years) + courses and clinical practice.
 - Bachelor's degree in Communication Sciences and Disorders + ASHA modules, courses, and clinical practice.
 - University degree + SLPA certification or specific courses, ASHA modules, courses, and clinical practice.

2. Meet the Mandatory Requirements:

- **100 hours of clinical practice** supervised by an ASHA-certified speech-language pathologist.
- Mandatory Courses:
 - \circ 1 hour in ethics
 - 1 hour in **universal safety precautions**
 - 1 hour in **patient confidentiality**
- Online educational modules (if applicable).

3. Submit the Application:

- **Payment** of the current certification fee.
- Submission of transcripts and certificates within 60 days of application.
- 4. Certification Exam:
 - Once the application is approved, **an eligibility ID** is issued to take the exam within **365 days**, with **up to two additional attempts** if not passed on the first try.
 - If the exam is passed, the C-SLPA certification is awarded, and the official ASHA credential is received.

5. Certification Maintenance:

- It must be **renewed every 3 years** by:
 - Completing the **certification maintenance assessment**.
 - Adhering to **ASHA's Code of Ethics**.
 - Paying **annual fees**.
